







Average population of one AH (persons)













Growth rate of local budgets general fund revenue per capita for January- July 2016-2019, % and UAH




Share of local taxes and fees in the local budgets own revenues (general fund), %



Growth rate of local taxes and fees in local budgets in January - June






**Expenditures per capita for January-July 2018


Remaining balance of local budgets in Ukraine, 2019



TRANSFER OF GENERAL EDUCATION INSTITUTIONS UNDER THE CONTROL OF LSG






Break down of ASCs


